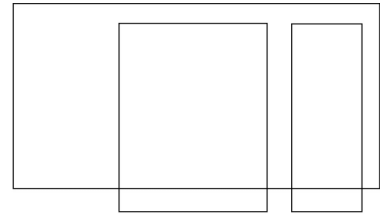
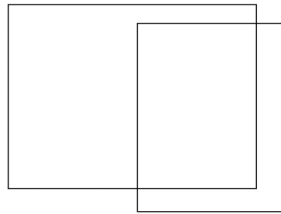
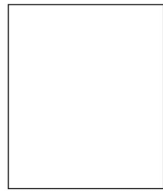

Tacoma Community College

- Life on campus
 - 8,000 student headcount
 - 5,200 student FTEs
 - Active student life
 - Clubs & orgs, programming – speakers, field trips, competitions between faculty and students, athletics
 - Improves retention rate
 - Diverse campus
 - Ages range between 16-70
 - Mixed socio-economic demographic
 - Running start program – approx. 250 FTEs
 - Low amount of square feet per student
 - 140 gross square feet per FTE
 - 75 net square feet per FTE
 - There is demand for international student housing
 - There is a major transit center on campus
 - 2,300 parking spaces

- *Library*
 - *Changed dramatically into a student-centered area offering tutoring services, large digital libraries, and different-sized gathering areas*
 - *Potential for joint relationship with city library*
- *Online/Distance Learning*
 - *Very active and growing*
 - *Hybrid classes allow for some personal contact and some distance learning*
 - *New technologies allow for distance learning to occur in most spaces – room dimension requirements for video screening are not applicable anymore*
- *Food Service*
 - *Small cafeteria - open a limited number of hours*
 - *Convenience store with 'grab and go' items – open for longer hours*
 - *Food service operates at a loss, since there are a number of places to eat across the street*
- *Community relationships*
 - *The college works as a whole to build community*
 - *Open /drop-in labs*
 - *There is currently no faculty to faculty community space*
 - *Provide conference services*
 - *Outreach to middle and high school students*
 - *Active member of the neighborhood association*
 - *The music program hosts concerts*
 - *TCC hosts high school sports competitions as well as sports and math camps in the summer (i.e. Gear Up)*
- *Relationship with UWT – improvement opportunities*
 - *Current dual enrollment program – has not been as successful as hoped*
 - *Public transit between TCC & UWT can take up to an hour*
 - *Need a direct link between campuses*
 - *A shuttle should be implemented as a temporary solution before the light rail link comes online in 10 years*
 - *Whatcom Community College's relationship with WWU is a good model for the potential between TCC and UWT*

Clover Park Technical College

- *Life on campus*
 - *3,500 student headcount*
 - *4,000 student FTEs*
 - *Running Start – less than 200 FTEs*
 - *29% of students have associates and bachelors degrees when they enroll*
 - *18 Allied Health programs*
 - *Fastest growing programs*
 - *Represent 20-30% of the student population*
 - *Not much student activity outside of classes*
 - *New collaborative approach to the development of the student center by students, the college, and the Lakewood community*
 - *The college wants to demonstrate this collaboration of resources by including a public element to the instruction that is featured (i.e. car show in the rotunda)*
 - *Encourage interaction by offering free lunch for faculty in the student center*

- *4 campuses outside of the main campus in Lakewood*
 - *South Hill*
 - *Fort Lewis*
 - *Downtown Tacoma*
 - *Brenden Conference Center*
- *Library*
 - *The budget has increased for library resources*
 - *Students prefer a highly digital environment*
 - *Existing space is constrained, not adequate*
 - *New project request to the state for media production and gathering spaces was not funded*
- *Online/Distance Learning*
 - *Not highly utilized*
 - *Students do not get aid for distance learning*
 - *Will grow with changes that better meet the needs of students*
- *Food Service*
 - *Cafeteria in the student center is leased to a commercial vendor*
 - *Convenience store and deli have longer hours*
 - *Culinary Arts program*
 - *Provide lunches Wednesday through Friday*
 - *Major draw for the community*
 - *The other CPTC campuses do not provide food service (South Hill, Fort Lewis, Downtown Tacoma)*
- *Community relationships*
 - *The faculty works with their cohort of students 6 hours a day for the length of the program*
 - *Community is achieved through maintaining important adjacencies*
 - *Faculty lounges and student center*
 - *The massage and cosmetology programs offer services to the community at large*
 - *Industry partners participate in advisory meetings*
 - *The City of Lakewood uses CPTC event facilities approx. 12 times a year*
 - *CPTC hosts high school math and science competitions as well as career fairs*
- *Opportunities for sharing resources and programs with UWT*
 - *Allied health programs*
 - *Thea Foss*
 - *TV studio, radio station*
 - *Service-learning*
 - *Capstone projects*
 - *Foster relationships with local non-profits*
 - *Dual enrollment*

Next Steps

- *UWT will have a similar conversation with the University of Puget Sound and Pacific Lutheran University*
- *Future meetings will be scheduled to continue conversation about shared opportunities between institutions*
