Language or International Course(s)

0-10 credits:

Option one (0 credits): Competency demonstrated outside of UWT: college level foreign language 103, three years high school foreign language, or native speaker certification.

Option Two (5 credits): One UWT foreign language course: TCXG 301, TCXG 302, or TCXG 303.

Option Three (10 credits): TSMIN 200/300 (International Interactions) or TGH 301 (Global Interactions) plus one additional IN course.

One Natural World course (Environmental Science)

5 credits:

Courses with a TESC prefix at UWT- if taken as a part of the US core (*see italicized options above*), then this is a free elective. Environmental science transfer courses may apply, see adviser for details.

Electives
