To declare Psychology as a concentration, students must have taken the following with a minimum of grade of 2.0:

- One General or Introductory Psychology course
- Two psychology foundation courses in the following areas: Personality Theories, Developmental Psychology (Lifespan or Child Development), Abnormal Psychology, Social Psychology
- One Introduction to Statistics course
